RAADA in a Glance

Rehabilitation Association and Agriculture Development for Afghanistan (RAADA) started its humanitarian activities in Government of Islamic Republic of Afghanistan in 2002. As a local Non-Governmental Organization (NGO), RAADA started working in Herat Province and extended its activities in western Afghanistan (Herat, Farah, Ghor and Badghis Provinces).

RAADA has worked with (CAID), Catholic Relief Services (CRS), FAO, International Rescue Committee (IRC), and USAID (through its sub-contractor ARD), ITERSOS, Civil Voluntary Group (CVG) and Sheladia Associates, Inc. (SAI). RAADA is currently working with US Embassy, Japan International Incorporation Agency (JICA) RAADA has already implemented more than 86 projects in many sectors; such as Humanitarian Aid, Emergency response, Agricultural and Animal Husbandry, Human rights, livelihood, social services, Industry and Energy generation.

Improving Production, Marketing and Protection of Livelihood in Kohsan

- The project goal was to contribute to livelihood sustainability through supports in products, gender equity and health awareness and its specific objective was to improve production, marketing and protection of livelihoods. Improved food security of the targeted beneficiaries through increased income as a result of livestock support and agricultural production components, Improved marketability of livestock products through hygienic and market demanded product processing practices introduced by the program, Decreased livestock mortality and morbidity rates due to provision of basic veterinary services in the village, Capability of the beneficiaries to have direct links with veterinary clinics as well as markets and traders of livestock products and carpet, Enhanced community participation in different decision making processes in the village, Improved awareness of female community members on women/men issues and strengthened women role in community issues as well as their improved economic capabilities to the family economy and The people got access to drinking water for themselves and their livestock.



Strengthening Afghan Civil Societies (SACS)

The overall project purpose was to strengthen Afghan Civil Societies to promote and protect the rights of Afghans especially among women, youth and disabled in the targeted communities (Zindajan, Kohsan, Ghorian, Karokh, Enjil, Guzarah, Aab Kamari, Qadis). Afghan civil societies and people didn't fully understand their rights and how to protect them. They didn't know that it is the government's responsibility to protect their rights. To reach this goal, the civil societies should be promoted, root causes of human rights abuses identified and later on advocated. This was done through, awareness raising on human rights, advocacy, dialogue sessions to find human rights abuses, meetings to find out the problems and process and finally doing advocacy. Project duration was 18 months.



Improving Sericulture in Herat Province Phase-II (ISHP-II)

Improving sericulture and economy of silk producers in Herat Province was the goal of this project. The impacts of project were: improved the productivity and quality of silk and improve silk value chain in Zinda jan district, Herat , collected information about silk value chain in the view of promotion of farmers' livelihood and socio-economy in Herat province and establish model of collaboration between DAIR and NGO in implementing of development projects. 2635 male and female directly benefited during 12 months of project.

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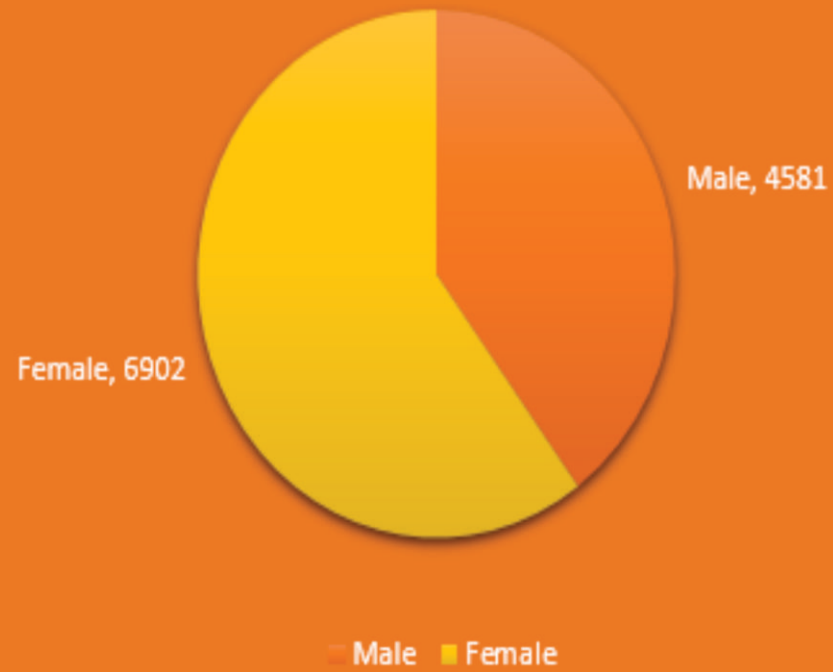
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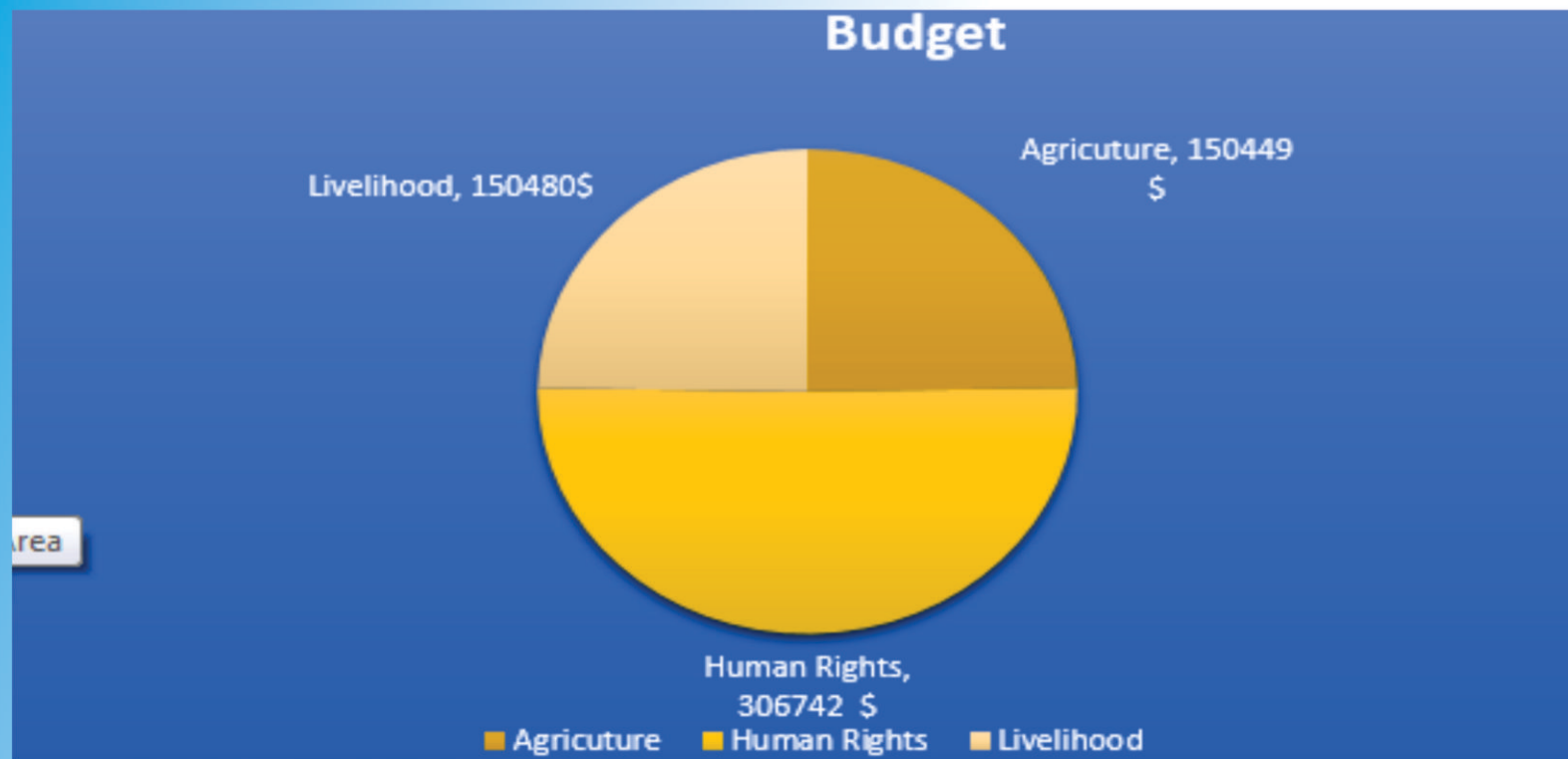
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Beneficiary Count
